I initially combined working independently with my NHS role. I had a mixed clinical/management role and supported a range of individuals (children and adults) in various settings. I lead the team in clinical skills and carry out regular support and supervision to ensure a high-quality service to all individuals and their families. My clinical caseload and expertise are comprised of individuals with acquired brain injuries and associated speech and language challenges. I am passionate about achieving high outcomes and ensure my knowledge and skills are kept up to date via regular training and conferences. I have presented in the UK and internationally on a range of associated communication difficulties.

I volunteer with Headway Stockport and South Manchester, where I assist in facilitating drop-in sessions for adults with acquired brain injuries. In this role, I am responsible for planning and organising events, games, and activities, as well as providing a supportive and approachable presence for service users to discuss any concerns or simply enjoy conversation.

Ace Centre North, Specialist Speech and Language Therapist · 2008 - 2012

Specialist multidisciplinary assessment and training team, ACE Centre North. Here I gained extended experience of working with children and adults with a range of needs such as complex physical disabilities and acquired neurological conditions such as strokes and MND. I carried out large scale training events and supported development and dissemination of the accredited AAC/AT modules.

Pennine Care, Specialist Speech and Language Therapist · 1998 – 2016

In my NHS role, I specialised in children who had profound and/or complex needs such as Cerebral Palsy, Motor Speech Disorders, Autistic Spectrum Disorders and individuals with learning difficulties. I also supported a range of clients with acquired communication difficulties following traumatic brain injury.

Over the years I have gained specialist skills in the area of AAC and worked predominantly with children aged 0-19 with a wide variety of individual needs. My role also included managing members of the team and carrying out support and supervision. I led the Long-Term Pathway which was the clinical pathway for pupils with more complex needs. I worked closely with other members of the MDT and set up a funded pathway for people that required high tech AAC.

In 2000 I completed the post basic dysphagia course and in 2010 I completed the advanced clinical practice in dysphagia. I worked at a level 3 tertiary hospital and worked within the community-based dysphagia service. I am experienced in managing dysphagia in both adult and paediatric clients.

- Presented at national and international conferences including Communication Matters, ISAAC, AAC SIG meetings, Autistic Spectrum Disorder (NW) SIG meetings, Autism Today Conference, MND SIG meetings and ACE Network Days.
- Exhibit and speak at major events around the UK, e.g. The Autism Show
- Training on MyAbility – a joint therapeutic intervention programme produced by ATtherapy and a psychology programme to support self-identity in individuals with autism, cerebral palsy and TBI.

2021 - ATtherapy have been awarded the Mike Barnes award for Innovative practice for MyAbility – a joint project between ATtherapy and Recolo in developing self-identity in teenagers and young adults with TBI, Cerebral Palsy and Autism.

2019 - ATmentors have won an award for innovative practice in providing mentor support for people using communication aids.
